Dear Fellow Parishioners.

Today we celebrate The Epiphany of the Lord. In the Gospel of Matthew 2:1-12, we read the narrative of the three magi coming to Jerusalem to find the new born King. They came from the East, traveling many miles, following a star, in hopes of finding the new born King. They come to King Herod for help, who unknowingly helps them. They find the child in Bethlehem with His mother. They prostrate themselves before Him and offer Him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Then they left another way.

The magi went out of their way, in search of Christ. They had wealth, comfort, security, and respect back home. Yet they left it all in search of this new king. A king who even the stars recognized. Herod knew it, but looked at Him as a threat to his kingdom. The priests and the scribes knew it, but would later see Him as a threat to their position. Only the strangers from a distance sought him out and offered Him praise. Once they found Him, they were changed and left a different way.

We have heard the narrative, of the birth of Christ. King Herod's attempt to find the child. The priest and the scribes acknowledging His coming. But the strangers recognized the child as the King. They were changed. Changed and changed their way of life. They did not return to their old ways.

Which group of individuals do we associate with? Do we find Jesus as a threat to our way of life? Are we afraid we would have to change? Would Jesus expect too much from us? Are we willing to search for Jesus following the message of the Gospels? Are we willing to accept Jesus as to who He is, and what He can do for us, and change our way?
