Dear Fellow Parishioners.

Today we read the narrative of Luke's message to Theophilus. In the Gospel of Luke 1:1-4. 4:4-21, he tells us of the events that have been fulfilled among us. How Jesus read the scroll in the synagogue: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tiding to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recover sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord." He sat down and said to them, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

Luke felt he had to share the message of Jesus. What he knew, he had to share with others. Every one of us should feel that same need. If Christ is truly the Savior, the Redeemer, the Eternal King, then we should be eager to bring as many people as possible into His Kingdom. The intensity of our desire to share our faith with those around us is a direct indication of the health and maturity of our soul. If we were to find the pearl of great price, we should want to tell everybody we meet about it.

Spreading Christ's Kingdom is every Christians' responsibility. God gives us the tools to do it. He gives us the Sacraments, the Holy Spirit, and scripture to help us. We have only to work with Him. Your servant in Christ, Deacon Martin

JUBILEE 2025—On Christmas Eve – December 24th 2024, Pope Francis opened the Holy Door of Saint Peter's Basilica as he ushered in the widely-anticipated 2025 Jubilee Year of Hope. The Pope inaugurated the Ordinary Jubilee, a historic event taking place every 25 years. The Ordinary Jubilee will conclude with the closing of the same Holy Door on January 6th 2026, the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. What is the Significance of the Holy Door? The Holy Door is deemed "holy" since it calls all those who enter through it to walk in holiness of life. The last opening of the Holy Door for an Ordinary Jubilee was when Pope St. John Paul II had done so in the Year 2000. The Holy Father has invited us to pray, to prepare ourselves throughout this year, so that this Jubilee may "strengthen us in our faith, helping us to recognize the Risen Christ in the midst of our lives, transforming us into pilgrims of Christian hope."
