Dear Fellow Parishioners,

In today's Gospel, Luke 6:39-45, we read of Jesus telling His disciples several parables. Can a blind person guide a blind person? No disciple is greater than the teacher. Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own? Every tree is known by its fruit.

Jesus is telling His disciples to look first at our own faults, our own flaws, before we look at our neighbors. Learn to deal with our own flaws, correct our own mistakes, beware of the sin of pride. Do not judge, do not be critical, that's God's job. Do not play God.

Often our flaws are bigger than what we see in others, because we may have the same flaw but add to it the sin of pride. I am better, I know more, I have more education, listen to me. Notice the phrases all start with I. I am the most important. When I react this way, I am not considering the other. I cannot bear good fruit.


A true test of ourselves is to notice how we react in a conflict. Big or small, how do we respond. Do we try and see through the other's eyes and their situation, or are we quick to criticize, pass judgment and give sentence. This is when we truly tell everyone who we really are. At the drop of a hat, we respond with harsh words. We need to clean up our own act before we try to help someone else.

Come to the Mardi Gras breakfast this Sunday, March 2nd. Parishioners are asked to bring potato, egg or fruit dishes, sweet rolls, or anything that you will enjoy for breakfast. This is an opportunity to get to know our new parishioners better. Help will be needed serving and cleaning up after.

March 4: Shrove Tuesday, at Holy Rosary, Cedar, at 6 p.m. Join the Legion of Mary in honoring the Holy Face of Jesus. Exposition, devotions, and Benediction as well as a special testimony from the Panta Leon Family. Paczki and coffee to follow.

March 5: Lent starts on Ash Wednesday with Mass at 7 a.m. and at 6:30 p.m. Ash Wednesday, All Fridays, and Good Friday are days of Fast and abstinence. This means that no meat is allowed. A fast day means that one full meal and two lesser meals are allowed. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics who have reached the age of fourteen. Fasting is for those who have reached the age of eighteen until the beginning of their sixtieth year. Little Black Books-6 Minute Reflection on the Sunday Gospels of Lent are available. Starting next weekend, there will be Stations of the Cross after weekend Masses. Mass. Readers of the day and altar servers are asked to stay and lead.

March 6: Thursday, the Parish Council will meet at 6:30 in the Church basement.

March 9: Day Light Saving Time ends next Sunday. Time springs one hour forward.

March 12: The Lenten program starts and includes Mass at 7 a.m. There will be a Holy Hour at 5 p.m. with Benediction and confession followed by a soup supper at 6 p.m. Fr. Class, S.J. will lead the Parish Lenten Program. He will take us through the Examen, a method of reviewing your day in the presence of God. It's actually an attitude more than a method, a time set aside for thankful reflection on where God is in your everyday life. It has 5 steps which most people take somewhat in order. All are welcome.


