#### Dear Fellow Parishioners,

In today's Gospel, Luke 4:1-13, we read of Jesus' temptation by the devil in the desert. This is right after His baptism by John the Baptist. He is lead into the a deserted place by the Spirit for forty days. He ate nothing during those days so He was very hungry. The devil tempts Him with these words; "If you are the Son of God, command that these stones become bread." The devil is questioning who Jesus is. He was not sure who this man was. Would He take care of His personal needs just because He was hungry? Would He do something only for Himself? Would He ignore His Father's will? The second temptation again includes: "If you worship me, I will give you all power

and glory." The devil is appealing to Jesus human nature again by giving Jesus a choice. He will give Him all the physical and material wealth, all the souls as well, for all time. Not just for a day. He will place all this under His control. Only "If".

The third temptation again includes: "If you are the Son of God, challenge Him to save you by throwing yourself off the temple heights. He is questioning the relationship Jesus has with God the Father.

We too are tempted by the devil in the same way. We are tempted to look out for ourselves, for our security, for our domain. Look out for number one. We also like control, power, to be in charge. It's like the old game kids once played, King of the Mountain. We all like recognition, affection, good relationships. What price are we willing to pay for these human desires? They are available for all of us in some form. What is our response to temptation?

**Lent is a time** when we are invited to go into the desert with Jesus: to share both his conflict and his victory, to feel something of our own weakness and temptations, to know the depth of our reliance on God's grace. In his message for Lent in 2024, Pope Francis reminds us that "Lent is a season of conversion, a time of freedom."

**Little Black Books**-6 Minute Reflection on the Sunday Gospels of Lent are available as are copies of *The Word Among Us.* They are all on the table in the vestibule.

**Starting this weekend,** there will be Stations of the Cross after weekend Masses. Readers and altar servers of the day are asked to stay and lead.

March 9: Day Light Saving Time ends this Sunday. Clocks spring one hour forward.

March 12: The Lenten program starts and includes Mass at 7 a.m. There will be a Holy Hour at 5 p.m. with Benediction and confession followed by a soup supper at 6 p.m. Fr. Class, S.J. will lead the Parish Lenten Program. He will take us through the Examen, a method of reviewing your day in the presence of God. It's actually an attitude more than a method, a time set aside for thankful reflection on where God is in your everyday life. It has 5 steps which most people take somewhat in order. All are welcome.

**Besides the Wednesday Mass at 7 a.m.,** Mass is celebrated on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday at 8:30 a.m.
