St. Wenceslaus Happenings

Lent is a time when we are invited to go into the desert with Jesus: to share both his conflict and his victory, to feel something of our own weakness and temptations, to know the depth of our reliance on God's grace. In his message for Lent in 2024, Pope Francis reminds us that "Lent is a season of conversion, a time of freedom." **Little Black Books-6 Minute Reflection on the Sunday Gospels of Lent** are available as are copies of *The Word Among Us.* They are all on the table in the vestibule.

There will be Stations of the Cross after weekend Masses during Lent. By praying the Stations of the Cross, we try to understand how much Jesus loved and suffered for each one of us by carrying the cross in our place. In this way, we can know and love Him more, and He is able to fill us with His love. We open our hearts and allow the Holy Spirit to teach us and fill us with fresh love and gratitude for Jesus. Our special friendship with Him grows deeper. Readers & Servers of the day are asked to stay & lead.

Bishop Walsh has asked that the we pray for our Holy Father, Pope Francis, during his hospitalization. We should offer a public rosary each day at 3 PM EST. If you are not able to do this, it is s encouraged that you offer one at another time of the day.

March 12: The Lenten program starts and includes Mass at 7 a.m., Holy Hour at 5 p.m. with Benediction and confession, followed by a soup supper at 6 p.m. Fr. Class, S.J. will lead the Parish Lenten Program. He will take us through the Examen, a method of reviewing your day in the presence of God. It's actually an attitude more than a method, a time set aside for thankful reflection on where God is in your everyday life. It has 5 steps which most people take somewhat in order. All are welcome.
