

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

In today's Gospel, John 20: 1-9, we hear of Mary of Magdala, coming to the tomb, early in the morning, on the first day of the week. This would be on a Sunday. She saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. She ran to Simon Peter and the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them what she had seen. Both disciples ran to the tomb. The younger arrived first but waited for Peter to enter. He went in and saw the burial cloth and the cloth that covered His head, rolled up in a separate place. The younger disciple went in saw, and believed the tomb to be empty. For they did not understand the Scripture that He had to rise from the dead.

Mary came early in the morning. She came in hast to the tomb, to be close to the body of Jesus, for She loved Jesus much. This is much like people visiting their loved ones in the cemetery. She was shocked, and maybe a little frighted. She runs to Peter, who would become the head of the church, one whom she trusted. Peter too, does not understand, even though Jesus told them that He must rise from the dead. They would come to believe much more after seeing the risen Jesus.


This is where our faith begins, at the empty tomb. It begins with the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Not just rising from the tomb, but by His own doing, never to die again. He lives on for all eternity. If He did not rise, there is no reason to believe. As St. Paul states: "If He did not rise we are to be the most pitied." We are fools.

But we do believe because there are many accounts of people seeing Him. The story is told by different authors. People were willing to die for this belief. You don't die for a scam. There was a dramatic change in the apostles. We do believe, we are not fools.
