Dear Fellow Parishioners,

In today's Gospel, John 10: 27-30, Jesus said: "My sheep hear My voice: I know them, and they follow Me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish."

Jesus often refers to Himself as the good shepherd. A good shepherd is willing to lay down his life for his sheep. He is not a hireling who runs in time of danger. He is there to protect them in all kinds of difficulties.

A shepherd walks in front of his flock, whistling or speaking or singing. The sheep follow along behind. As long as they can hear the shepherd's voice, they keep following, they have to stay close enough to hear his voice. As long as the shepherd is close, the wolves will not attack the sheep. Only when a sheep falls behind, out of reach of the shepherd's voice, is there danger of getting lost and attacked.

Jesus wants to stay close to us, and He wants us to stay close to Him, close enough so we can always hear His voice. That way we can be sure to arrive safely to the rich pastures and refreshing streams of a meaningful, joyful life. He is not a distant God, and He doesn't want to save us from far away. This is the image God has of himself: our good shepherd, leading us through the dark and dangerous valleys of this world by walking right beside us, by staying always within hearing in the sacrament of confession, in the Eucharist, in the Pope, in the Bible. He is not a cowboy driving us on from behind and keeping his distance; He is our shepherd, and He wants us to hear His voice. Learn His voice; listen carefully and follow Him.
