Today we celebrate the Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary time. In today's Gospel: Luke 12:13-21, Jesus tells the parable about a rich man whose land produced a bountiful crop, so much so that his barns were not big enough to store it all. He decides to tear down his barn and build new ones. He says to himself: Now I have many good things stored up for myself, I can eat drink and be merry. But God said to him, "You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you, to whom will these things belong." So it is for all who store up treasures for themselves, but not rich in what matters to God.


Jesus doesn't want us to spend our lives building barns that we will never use. He wants us to spend our lives building his everlasting kingdom in our hearts and in the world. "All Christians, rich or poor, must keep their eye fixed on heaven, remembering that 'we have not here a lasting city, but we seek one that is to come' (Heb 13:14)." Pope Pius XI. "God does not expect us to be successful but to be faithful." Blessed Mother Teresa of Calcutta said to take care to guard against all greed. If we want a truly fulfilling life, we should strive to be "rich in what matters to God."

Life is brief, and if we put all our trust and effort in the things of this world, they will leave us empty. We need to remember that this world is passing away, and that our final destination is heaven. Too much other-worldly focus could actually be a vice, if it led us to neglect our current duties. Christ wants to encourage us to remember that our lives are brief, and that eternity is closer every day. He wants us to live with our eyes fixed on heaven, where we will see him face to face in joy everlasting. Christ wants us to live today in such a way that we're ready for the eternal tomorrow of God. Eternity has started for all of us. The direction we take is our choice. Our choice will depend on where we will end up. Choose wisely.
