Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. In today's Gospel: Luke 17:5-10, the apostles ask Jesus to increase their faith. Jesus replies: "If you had the faith of a mustard seed the trees would obey you if you asked them to jump into the sea."


Their request to Jesus to increase their faith seems to imply both great humility and great faith to begin with. Humility because they are not content with the amount of faith they have. Faith because they ask him for the gift of faith, which implies that he is God. For no mere human being can give the gift of faith to another.

Then he tells the parable of the faithful servant who obeys the master's orders to serve him: that he is only an "unprofitable servant". The servant did the minimum well, but only the minimum, and thought it was good enough. The servant did not go beyond the call of duty. He was proud to serve just enough. Jesus' words are a reminder to be humble and not to fall into spiritual pride. The danger of spiritual pride is that it is so subtle and quietly insidious in our lives. We don't see the damage it is doing before it's already too late.

We as Christians are asked to do more than obey the commandments, live our vocation, and attend church services. We are to be consciously aware of doing our best, going beyond the minimal duties daily. Serving others is serving Jesus Christ. Being the best we can, thinking positively, less critical. Giving 110%, and relying on God's mercy. Being humble and striving to be Holy. It is not our works that save us; we do not earn our way to heaven. It is accepting God's salvation, showing our acceptance by our actions, leading a faith filled life. We rely on Gods help, ... **Continued on next page**


