Today we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord, showing to the world the coming of Christ to earth. Three men from the East came in search of the newborn king of the Jews. All in Jerusalem were troubled including King Herod. He consults with the chief priest and scribes as where this Christ was to be born. They tell Him in Bethlehem of Judea. Secretly he meets with the three men and tells them to search for the child and come back to him when they find the child. They left and followed the star until it came to rest over the house where the child and his mother were. They prostrated themselves and offered Him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Having been warned in a dream, they left another way.

These three wise men may have heard about the Jewish religion of a monotheistic and moral religion. They traveled miles, following a star in search of the new born king of the Jews.
