

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Third Sunday in Ordinary time. In today's Gospel, Mark 1:14-20, John the Baptist was arrested. Jesus comes to Galilee and proclaims the Gospel: the Kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the Gospel. As He passed the Sea of Galilee, He sees Simon and his brother Andrew casting their nets in the sea. Jesus invites them to come after Him and He would make them fishers of men. They left their nets and followed Him. A little farther He met James and John mending their nets with their father. He invites them to follow Him as well. They too left their nets with their father and the hired help.

These men had met Jesus before. They thought He might be the Messiah, the man who would free them from Rome. They went without question. Following Jesus not knowing where they were going or what they would be doing. They had trust and confidence in this man.

Jesus did not ask these men for their resume, their education, their health, their financial status, their social status, or for a recommendation from someone. Jesus did not interview them, but took them as they were, where they were, with what they had. He met them in the ordinary work of the day. Nothing special.

Jesus meets us where we are. He asks us to follow Him. He wants us to trust Him. We know He is the Messiah. We know who He is. We have good reason to become fishermen, to become one of His disciples. Now is a good time to take up the invitation and share the message of Jesus Christ.




