

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary time. In today's Gospel, Mark 1:29-39, Jesus goes to Peter's home. He heals Peter's mother-in-law and she got up and waited on them. In the evening they brought them all who were ill and possessed by demons. He cured many who were sick with various diseases and drove out many demons, not permitting them to speak.

Rising very early, before dawn, He left and went off to a deserted place to pray. This Jesus, who was the son of God, a man who was without sin, a man whose mind was beyond brilliant, was filled with understanding and compassion. This man, who gave of himself tirelessly, went out to pray.

Yet, this man needed to reserve time just to be alone with His Father. He needed to go off and pray. He even had to get up early in order to make time for it. Sometimes He had to stay up late in order to make time for it. But He always did it, even on the night of His crucifixion, in the Garden of Gethsemane.

Jesus, who was perfect, needed prayer in order to fulfill His life's mission. What does that imply for us? We, who are so imperfect, so weak, so vulnerable to every sort of temptation and wounded by every kind of sin, do we not have need to pray?

If daily prayer was essential for Christ, it must be even more essential for Christ's less than perfect followers. We all need to schedule prayer into our daily lives. Early or late, it is essential for us all. Pray!



Please pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life.


