Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Fifth Sunday in Lent. In today's Gospel, John 12:20-33, Jesus answers His disciples: "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified, Amen, Amen, I say to you. Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat, but if it dies, it produces much fruit."

Jesus was talking about several things. First He was talking about His own death. The time had come for Jesus to be glorified by His agony, suffering, crucifixion, and resurrection. This is called the Pascal Mystery. His dying and Resurrection conquered death for all time. He paved the way for us to enter into eternity. This is why He came to earth.

Secondly, He is telling us that unless we die to self, we can not have eternal life. We all know by experience that the most joyous time is when we can share our life, our time, our talent to help someone. It gives us a warm feeling inside that seems to touch our heart. This is what Jesus is talking about. We need to die to selfish tendencies, to me first attitude, to looking out for only me, for seeking only my pleasure. When we die to our selfishness, the Holy Spirit will replace them with kindness, joy, charity, peace, gentleness, faith, modesty, self-control, long-suffering, to name a few. We will be born a new. We will really experience the Kingdom of God. If only for a moment. Not in it's fullness, but partially. It prepares us for the full experience in heaven.

Fifth Sunday of Lent: Throughout the gospels, Jesus uses the image of being "lifted up" to describe his crucifixion. After Jesus was nailed to the cross, he was physically lifted up—a painful, yet exalting moment—for through the cross he brought salvation. While he understood his impending suffering, Jesus knew its purpose. He promised to "draw everyone" to himself (John 12:32), knowing that the cross would remove the barrier between us and our relationship with the Father. Reflect upon the cross today. Let it speak of God's infinite love and thank him for his willingness to suffer and die so that we may live.


