Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. In John 20:19-31, we read the narrative of Thomas doubting the risen Jesus. When Jesus enters the locked room, He said to them "Peace be with you". He then showed them His hands and His side. He breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit, whose sins you forgive are forgiven, whose sins you retain are retained".

Thomas was not there the first time, but was with the disciples a week later. Jesus again appeared and said "Peace be with you". Jesus asked Thomas to put his finger into His hands and put his hand into His side. Thomas responds, "My Lord and my God".

Jesus then speaks directly to us: "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed". Jesus addresses His disciples with the words, "Peace be with you". The disciples that had all abandoned Him. He was left alone in the garden, at His trial, in the courtyard, carrying His cross, and at the crucifixion. They were nowhere to be found in Jesus' time of need. Yet Jesus first words to the disciples were: "Peace be with you".

Jesus forgave them and gave them the power to forgive others as well. He gave us the sacrament of reconciliation. We know this as confession. We should use it often. We should also forgive each other as Jesus did. **Peace be with you.**




