Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate Pentecost Sunday. This is nine days after the Ascension, 50 days after the Resurrection. This is the length of a novena. This is the day the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles, frightened, they hid in a locked room. They prayed for nine days together. On the tenth day, the Holy Spirit descended on them in the form of tongues of fire, and they were a changed people. They boldly went out and proclaimed the risen Christ. Hundreds heard the message in their own language.

The Spirit appeared as tongues of fire because it gave the power to speak, not in their own minds, but in the mind of God. Not with their own tongues, that is their own language, a new language they never learned from human beings, but the language given them by the Holy Spirit. The Pentecost miracle, where everyone understands each other's tongue, reverses the babble of the Tower of Babel, where language was confused.

This miracle of the Holy Spirit, is available to us today. We have to remember the Apostles prayed for nine days together, away from the world, away from distractions, in a private room. Asking for direction, they accepted the Spirit in their lives. It did not just happen. They did something together, they prayed in unison, with one mind, depending on each other. This same Spirit can change our lives as well if we follow their example of praying together, and accepting the Holy Spirit's help.

Area Happenings


