

#### Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. In today's Gospel, Matthew gives a very short account of the end of Christ's bodily life on earth. It contains six facts that are life-changing, six of the most important things Christ said at the end of His incarnate earthly life, before He ascended back into heaven.

First, the risen Christ was seen by His disciples, by their bodily eyes. In fact, St. Paul mentions that there were more than five hundred people alive at that time who had seen Christ after the Resurrection. The Resurrection is a historical fact, not a fancy, or fantasy, or a fiction.

Second, Christ was not only revered and loved, but adored and worshiped as God. For only God can conquer death. The divinity of Christ was not a later invention of the Church: it went back to the earliest disciples and to Christ Himself.

Third, they worshiped and doubted. We have free will to choose to believe or not. It was not only Thomas who doubted.

Fourth, Christ has authority over everything in heaven and earth, everything in our lives, without exception. Authority means not just power, but rightful power, the power of right.

Fifth, our job is to spread the Good news, both as Church and as individual. To preach by word and by deeds, especially by the deed of Baptism. The command given to us by Christ Himself.

Sixth, Christ's last solemn and infallible promise to us is that he will never leave us alone, but will be with us always, until the end of time. Christ is with the Father always, eternally. He will no more leave us than He will leave His Father. When we feel desperate, helpless, and hopeless, we must remember this divine and infallible promise. It is our fortress, our anchor, and our lighthouse. Believe, it is a great consolation.
