

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Today we celebrate The Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time. In today's Gospel passage from Mark 10:17-30, he presents us with a compelling encounter between Jesus and a rich young man. This young man, seeking eternal life, approaches Jesus with sincerity and reverence. He asks the pivotal question: "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?"

The young man states he has kept the commandments, yet something is still missing. Jesus, knowing the depth of his heart, challenges him: "Go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." The young man, though earnest, walks away in sorrow, unable to part with his wealth. Jesus then turns to his disciples and says, "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!" The disciples ask: "Then who can be saved?" Jesus answers: "For human beings it is impossible, but all things are possible for God." We will need His help, we can not do it alone.


Jesus is teaching us that our possessions represent not only our material wealth but also the attachments and distractions that can dominate our lives. He calls us to a radical discipleship that demands a willingness to let go of anything that prevents us from a deeper relationship with Him.

We might ask ourselves: What are our own attachments? Is it our desire for comfort, status, TV, Facebook, or security that keeps us from responding fully to God's call? When we let go of our excessive attachments, we make time for God, we make space for God's grace to enter our lives. This allows our relationship to grow as we journey to receive our inheritance of eternal life. What is holding us back? Give God a chance. Trust in the Lord and we will be greatly rewarded.
