Today we celebrate The Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time. In today's Gospel passage from Mark 12:28b-34, a scribe asks Jesus which is the first of all commandments? Jesus responds with: "Hear O Israel! The Lord our God is lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul. With all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself." In doing this you are not far from the kingdom of God.

Loving God is first. He alone is our God. Nothing comes before Him. This we often read over quickly. Our modern world has given up on the idea of God. Government and popular culture have almost succeeded in keeping God in the closet. Jesus gives it top priority.




