Today we celebrate the feast the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. In today's Gospel, Luke 2:22-40, we read about Mary, Jesus, and Joseph taking Jesus to the temple for purification. In this narrative they fulfill the law of Moses, consecrating Jesus to the Lord, offering the sacrifice of a pair of young pigeons.
