

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

In today's liturgy, Matthew 5:17-37, we celebrate the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary time. In Today's Gospel, there are many lessons. Each of the lessons taught in today's Gospel passage could be expanded into an entire book. The core of them all, however, is in the heart.

Jesus is trying to tell us that exterior behavior, that appearances, are not enough. For a true, faithful citizen of Christ's Kingdom, the attitudes and desires of the heart must also be in harmony with God's plan for our lives. This is what Jesus means when He says: "I have come to fulfill" to bring the Old Testament Law to its fulfillment.

Friendship with God (which is what Jesus offers) requires a union of hearts. Christ is expanding the law from this perspective when He explains the true meaning of sinful anger, lust, and lying. If God wills all men to be saved, to end up in heaven, how can our friendship with Him be complete when we harbor resentment or contempt towards others, or tarnish their good name by spreading rumors about them, or speaking ill of them?

How can I live in intimacy with God who loves every man and woman, when in my heart I desire to use them only as a object of pleasure, or self-indulgence, or for profit? How can I be a true friend of God, when I make promises that I don't intend to keep? Other people may be satisfied with merely exterior success, with a hefty "bottom line". Christ is interested in every line. He looks all the way into our hearts, not just to appearances, He knows our deepest motivations and our desires.

If we want to know the true condition of our hearts, of our friendship with Christ, all we have to do is reflect about our words, and the quality of our conversations and actions. Is this the way Christ would be? **Your servant in Christ, Deacon Martin**

The law of abstinence binds all Catholics who have reached the age fourteen until the beginning of their sixtieth year. (Ashes at St Mary's at 8:00 a.m. and 6 p.m.).

February 25: St. Wenceslaus Lenten Program starts with Holy Hour and Benediction at 5:30 p.m., Father's presentation at 6:15 p.m. and Soup at 6:30 p.m.

Saturday, February 28, The **Annual Men's Soup Supper**, 5:30-7:00 p.m. Come for fellowship and enjoy some tasty Vegetable Beef or Potato Soup and help Third World Countries.
