



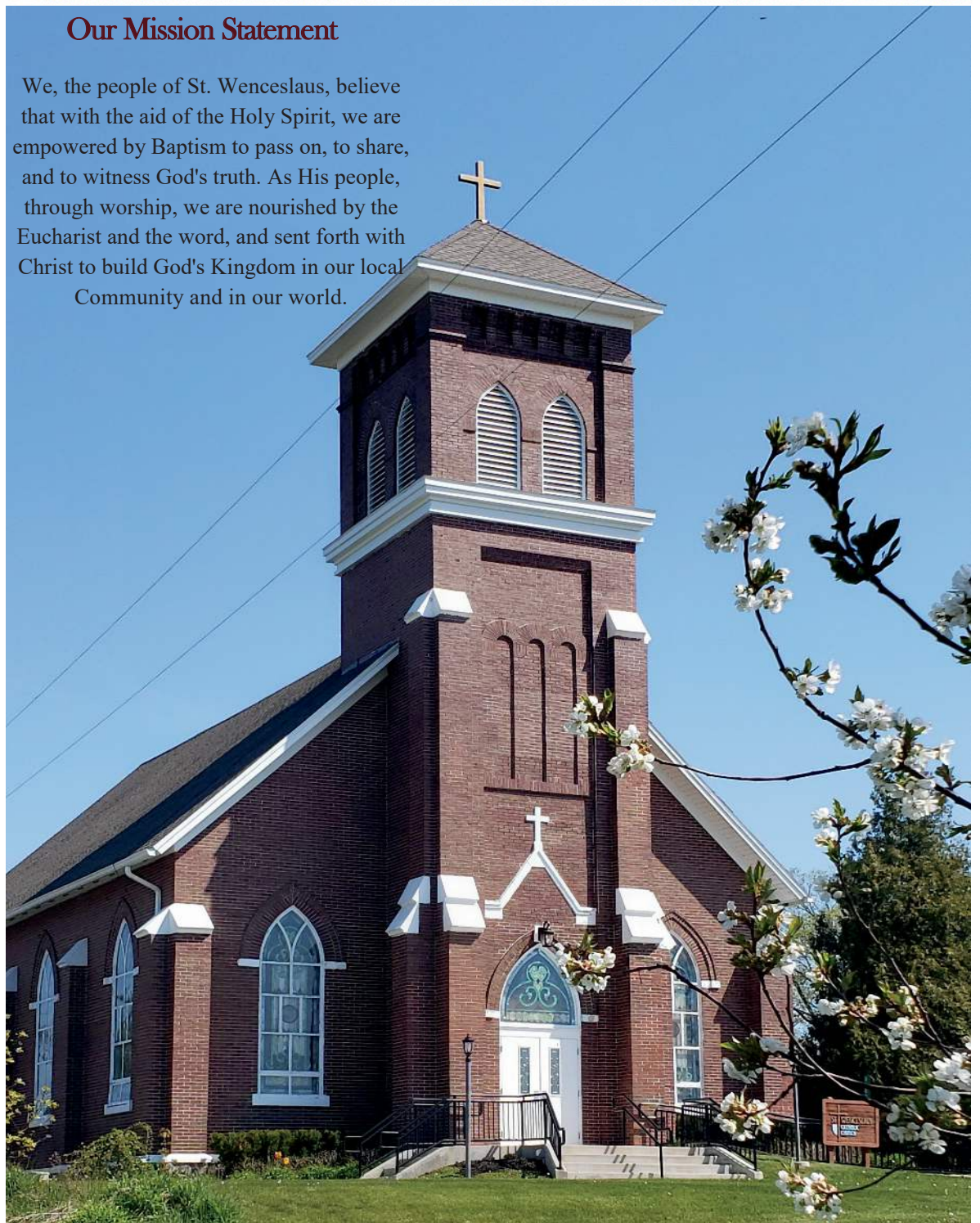

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

In today's liturgy, from Luke 24:13-35, we read the story of two of Jesus' disciples leaving Jerusalem heading towards Emmaus. They had witnessed the cruel treatment, the crucifixion, and death of Jesus. He was their friend and hope of Him to be the Messiah, the liberator of Israel. They were crushed at the sight of His death. They were leaving all their hopes and dreams of a new life. Then a stranger came into their life who explained the Old Testament. He told how the Messiah would have to suffer and die. When they broke bread, they recognized Him. Then Jesus left them. The two disciples returned to share the news.

As the scripture was being explained, their hearts began to burn. They became deeply interested and focused on what was being said. Scripture was taking on a new meaning. The breaking of bread opened their eyes to who the stranger was, Jesus. What's powerful in this narrative is that they recognized Jesus while they were holding the Eucharist in their hands. This seems to be clearly something Jesus wanted and planned. Jesus desires now that we should find Him in the Eucharist.

What Jesus taught those first disciples, He teaches us today. In the Liturgy of the Word, we hear Jesus. In the Liturgy of the Eucharist, we see Jesus, and we touch Jesus. He is as real to us today as He was to His disciples. Welcome Him into your life at Mass. Be conscious of His presence. He is really here.
